Legal challenges

- 1. <u>Legal challenge</u> to Privacy Shield in General Court by La Quadrature du Net, French Data Network and FDN Industry Association annulment of Privacy Shield sought 02.11.16
- 2. Digital Rights Ireland <u>legal challenge</u> against Irish Data Protection Commissioner asserted failure to implement the data protection law/Charter of Fundamental Rights through failure to ensure that the Commissioner is independent 31.10.16
- Current Digital Rights Ireland challenge to Privacy Shield details now published in <u>Official Journal</u> annulment of decision of EC sought & declaration implementing decision by EC is manifest error of assessment & is null & void
- 4. UK Supreme Court to <u>hear Article 50 Brexit appeal</u> in relation to the High Court <u>judgment</u> in *R* (*On the application of Miller & Dos Santos*) *v Secretary of State for Exiting the European Union* on 5-8 December 08.11.16
- 5. Judgment from <u>CJEU</u> due on 21 Dec in <u>*Davis and Watson*</u> case concerning UK's bulk retention & access to communications data 30.11.16
- 6. Bavarian Data Protection Authority <u>fines company</u> for appointing IT manager as its data protection officer due to conflict of interests highlights risks under the GDPR -12.11.16
- 7. <u>Brown v Commissioner of Police for the Metropolis</u> damages in the event of unauthorised disclosure and use of personal data, and the tort of misuse of private information referred to at last meeting & included for reference 07.10.16
